

- 7. Provision of Sufficient Learning Resources






Delivering Equality of Opportunity in Schools (DEIS)

- Range of additional supports provided to schools








Rationale

- Reflect the voice of sample DEIS schools



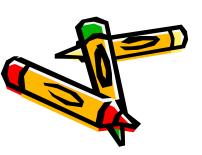


